In the first year you will be reading Homer's 'Odyssey' and learning about Greek religion. Completing this summer work will provide you with a sound introduction to the course.

Activity

Research the 12 Olympian Gods

Identify the 12 Olympian gods of ancient Greek religion. What symbols are they associated with? Choose two gods/goddesses and briefly summarise a mythological story associated with each of them. https://www.theoi.com/ is a recommended website to use.

A summary of Book 1 of "The Odyssey"

There are two different stories about the birth of the goddess Aphrodite. Democratic Athens was pitted against the militaristic oligarchy of Sparta in a bloody struggle for control of Greece. The Peloponnesian War provides a backdrop to your studies of Classical Civilisation and knowing about some of the key events in the war will help you to contextualise your understanding of the subject.
